

- Distance from Bagdogra Airport to Phuentsholing: 4:00 hr (150.8 km) via road.
- Airport Pickup: Scheduled between 02:00 pm and 03:00 pm at Bagdogra Airport.
- Airport Drop: Scheduled at 04:00 pm. Kindly book your flight after 6:00 PM onwards or consider staying near Bagdogra Airport at your own expense and catching a flight the next day.

Important Notice:

- If arriving and departing by train at **New Jalpaiguri (NJP) Station**, the vehicle will pick you up and drop you off at Tinbatti More, located approximately 3.7 km (around 11 minutes by road) from NJP Station.
- Our team member will be at the airport to coordinate and arrange your pickup.
- Please note: If your pickup or drop falls outside our designated time, you can arrange a separate vehicle at your own expense.

 (Details Should be written in English not in regional language)
- Notice: Aadhaar Card is not accepted for adults or children.
- If using a Voter ID, it must be the original issued by a government office, not a PVC card printed from an online download.
- No passport-size photocopies or any copies of your Voter ID or passport are required; only the original documents need to be carried.

DAY - 3	Explore Thimphu's sights and attractions. Overnight in Thimphu.
DAY - 4	Travel to Phobjikha Valley via Dochula Pass. Stay overnight in Phobjikha.
DAY - 5	Visit Black Necked Crane Festival and proceed to Punakha. Overnight stay in Punakha.
DAY - 6	Travel from Punakha to Paro. Explore Paro and stay overnight.
DAY - 7	Hike to Tiger's Nest Monastery. Enjoy the evening in Paro.
DAY - 8	Transfer from Paro to Bagdogra End of trip.









DAY 1: Bagdogra to Phuentsholing

Travel time: 4:00 to 5:00 hr (150.8 km)

- Your Bhutan adventure begins as you land at Bagdogra Airport. From here, we'll drive towards Jaigaon, the Indian town bordering Bhutan. At the Pedestrian Terminal, our team will assist you in smoothly crossing into Bhutan and entering Phuentsholing—your gateway to the Land of the Thunder Dragon.
- Upon arrival at your hotel in Phuentsholing If you're up for a short walk we recommend visiting Zangtopelri
 Lhakhang, a serene temple located in the heart of town.
- In the evening, during dinner, we'll officially welcome you with a special celebratory cake and offer you a local
 Bhutanese wine to mark the beginning of this beautiful journey on a joyful note. After dinner, you can head to karaoke session at Samsara Club
- Overnight stay: Phuentsholing.
- Must try Café: Kizom Café and Mountain Café.











DAY 2: Phuentsholing to Thimphu

Travel time: 4 hr (145.6 km)

- After breakfast, get your bags packed and ready.
- Once immigration is complete, begin your scenic drive to Thimphu, Bhutan's charming capital. The journey is full of breathtaking views and unforgettable stops:
- Gedu Stupa: Take a peaceful break at Eight Dharma Kaya
 Stupas beautiful hilltop stupa.
- Lunch Stop: Enjoy a delicious meal en route, surrounded by the serene countryside.
- Wangkha Waterfalls: Marvel at the cascading waters—a perfect spot for a quick photo and a moment to soak in nature.
- **Chuzom:** Witness the stunning confluence of the Paro and Thimphu rivers, flanked by traditional Bhutanese chortens.
- By evening, you'll arrive in Thimphu. Take some time to explore the vibrant **Clock Tower** and stroll through the lively streets at your own pace.
- Overnight stay: Thimphu.
- Nightlife in Thimphu: Check out Mojo Park or Space 34 for live music, dancing, and a great vibe.











Day 3: Thimphu Sightseeing

Travel time: Around Thimphu city

- Have Breakfast, You'll spend the day exploring Thimphu's attractions today.
- **Drive by National Memorial Chorten:** This large chorten is one of the most visible landmarks in Thimphu, and for many Bhutanese it is the focus of daily worship.
- **Simply Bhutan:** Step into a living museum where you can experience Bhutanese culture firsthand—try archery, join a traditional dance, and sample the local spirit, Aara.
- Buddha Dordenma: On the top of Kuensel Phodrang hill sits the statue of Sakyamuni Buddha. The 51.5-meter long bronze statue would surely attract you and the uninterrupted view of the valley would leave you spellbound. The site is also known as Buddha View Point.
- Takin Preservation Centre: You will find the National animal of Bhutan "Takin" in this open zoo. Takin is one of the most endangered species of the World and it is available only in Bhutan.
- Thangthong Dewachen Dupthop Nunnery: This peaceful hilltop monastery run by Buddhist nuns—offering a rare chance to interact with Bhutan's female monks.
- **Bhutan Postal Museum:** Discover Bhutan's fascinating postal history and explore the story behind the country's unique and world-famous postage stamps.
- Authentic Craft Bazaar: You can explore stalls and shops filled with intricately designed items, many of which are handmade by skilled artisans from across the country.
- You'll stay overnight in Thimphu







DAY 4: Thimphu to Phobjikha

Travel time: 3 hr 38 min (129.6 km)

- On this beautiful morning, after enjoying a hearty breakfast, it's time to pack your bags for an unforgettable journey to Phobjikha Valley. Our first stop is the **Dochula Pass 3050 m**, where you'll be treated to breathtaking views of 108 chortens dotting the landscape against the backdrop of majestic mountains.
- For the adventurous souls, consider trekking along the
 Natural Trail. A pleasurable walk (around 2 hours) that gives
 a nice feeling for Phobjikha Valley. It is the most beautiful and
 shortest of the existing nature trails in Bhutan. From the small
 hilltop overlooking Gangtey Goemba, head downhill through
 flower meadows to Semchubara village and from here
 through beautiful forests and into the open valley.
- Additionally, visit the Phobjikha Visitor Center to learn more about the valley's unique ecosystem and the conservation efforts for the endangered black-necked cranes, which migrate here during the winter months.
- As night falls, retreat to your cozy accommodation in Phobjikha Valley.









DAY 5: Phobjikha to Punakha.

Travel time: 2hr 30 min hours, 79 KMS

- Start your day with a hearty breakfast before heading to the **Black Necked Crane Festival**: The Festival is a vibrant and culturally rich event held annually in the scenic Phobjikha Valley, Bhutan. This festival celebrates the arrival of the blacknecked cranes, which migrate to Bhutan from Tibet during the winter months. The cranes hold deep cultural significance in Bhutanese folklore, symbolizing peace, love, and the spirits of departed loved ones.
- After lunch, travel to Punakha. If time allows, We will complete any one from the following sightseeing options:
- **Punakha Dzong:** Explore this stunning fortress, known for its impressive architecture and historical significance.
- Suspension Bridge: Take a walk across Bhutan's longest suspension bridge, offering breathtaking views of the valley.
- Optional Activity: River Rafting: Experience the thrill of a 10KM rafting adventure on the Mo Chhu river, featuring 10 exciting rapids! Each raft accommodates 6 people, and the rafting time is approximately 1.5 hours.
- In the evening you can stroll around Kaja Throm: One can witness a beautiful local market which showcases the best of what locals have to offerto visitors. You can enjoy the gardens, live music, food & drinks, and meet local Bhutanese farmers. This can be one of the best places to hang out after sightseeing.
- Enjoy an overnight stay in Punakha, with breakfast and dinner provided at the hotel.







DAY 6: Punakha to Paro.

Travel time: 3 hr, 114.8 km.

- As the morning sun rises, complete your remaining sightseeing in Punakha before heading to Paro.
- Punakha Dzong Also known as "the palace of great happiness"
 This Dzong is the most picturesque of all Bhutan ancient
 fortresses and it joins the mainland by an arched wooden bridge
 that contains many precious relics from the days when
 successive kings reigned the Kingdom from this Punakha valley
- Suspension Bridge This hidden treasure in the Punakha Valley connects the rest of the valley to the old administrative center of Punakha Dzongkhag the whole deck is covered with prayerflags and provides a perfect spot for bird watching and photography.
- Optional Activity: River Rafting The Mo Chhu river rafting is 10KM course which comprises of 10 rapids. The raft is 6-seater. River rafting time is approximately 1.5 hours. and Start for Paro.
- Visit to the Paro Airport viewpoint. From this vantage point, you'll enjoy stunning panoramic views of the airport nestled amidst the picturesque valley surrounded by lush green hills. Take in the sights and capture memorable photographs before we continue our exploration of the charming town of Paro.
- Rinpung Dzong night view: Highlight of the day, Just before
 entering Paro town Enjoy the enchanting night view of Rinpung
 Dzong! As the sun sets, the fortress-monastery lights up,
 creating a magical ambiance that's sure to leave you spellbound.
 It's a sight you won't want to miss! Don't forget to capture this
 mesmerizing sight with Bhutanese attire in some beautiful
 photos.

Day 7: Hike to Tiger's Nest

Hike time: Around 6 to 7hours, altitude: 3,120 m, 6.4 km

- Pack a small backpack and start your day early with a hearty breakfast—today is the highlight of your Bhutan journey.
- Taktsang Monastery (Tiger's Nest Hike): Begin the iconic hike to Bhutan's most sacred site, perched dramatically on a cliff 3,000 feet above the Paro Valley.
- This spiritual and scenic trail takes you through lush pine forests and rhododendron groves, with panoramic views at every turn.
- Reaching the monastery is both a physical accomplishment and a soulful experience.
- Bonus: You'll be awarded a Tiger's Nest Hike Completion
 Certificate to celebrate your achievement!

Optional Activity (Pay on the Spot)

- Traditional Bhutanese Hot Stone Bath: (Must Try) After the hike, go for a hot stone bath—an age-old Bhutanese therapy believed to relieve deep muscle fatigue and promote relaxation.
- Evening at Leisure: Explore the Paro market for local souvenirs and handicrafts, or unwind at your hotel after a fulfilling day.
- Overnight Stay: Paro












Day 8: Paro to Bagdogra Airport drop Travel time: 9 hours, 296 km.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



1. We're a couple, do we need to share a room?

 No, you do not need to share a room. Couples can opt for double sharing without sharing with other travelers.

2. I'm traveling Solo, how will I be accommodated?

• For solo travelers, accommodation will be arranged on a twin sharing basis with same-gender.

3. What currency is used in Bhutan?

• Bhutan's national currency is the Ngultrum (BTN). However, Indian currency is widely accepted everywhere. so there's no need to exchange INR for Bhutanese Ngultrum.

4. Are ATMs / Credit Card available in Bhutan?

• While there are ATMs in Bhutan. It's advisable to carry sufficient cash to ensure smooth transactions during your trip. Credit card is still not common in Bhutan. Very few stores/hotels accept VISA card with 5% charges.

5. Is Bhutan safe for solo traveling?

• Yes, Bhutan is considered one of the safest destinations for solo travelers. It offers a welcoming and secure environment. However joining a group can help reduce these costs.

6. Are there any restrictions on dress?

• There are no rules about what visitors should wear. However for visiting places like religious sites, respectful clothing that covers your body from shoulders to knees is appropriate and appreciated.

7. How much cash can I bring into Bhutan?

You may bring cash equivalent to US\$10,000 into the country.

8. What is the weather like in Bhutan and when is the best time to visit?

Bhutan is a year-round destination. There are four seasons: summer (June to August), autumn (September to November), winter (December to February) and spring (March to May). But because of the range of altitudes in the country, and the influence of the north Indian monsoons, the climate is incredibly varied.

9. Additional Expenses Overview.

To assist with your trip planning, here's an estimate of additional expenses:

- Lunch: Approximately Rs. 300.00 to Rs. 500.00 pp per meal. Note: Prices may vary, especially for authentic Bhutanese meals.
- Entrance Fees for Monuments: Around Rs. 5000.00 pp in total for all sightseeing places.
- Punakha River Rafting: Approximately Rs. 2000.00 pp.
- Hot Stone Bath: Approximately Rs. 1500.00 to Rs. 2000.00 pp.

Please note that these amounts are approximate and may vary based on actual consumption and current rates. We recommend planning accordingly and feel free to contact us for any further details or questions you may have.

DOS AND DON'TS FOR YOUR TRIP TO BHUTAN



Dos:

- A prayer wheel contains a scroll of mantras at its core, called a "Life Tree." The wheel is always spin clockwise,
- Photography Guidelines: Always ask for permission first and only take photos after receiving it. Additionally, refrain from photographing police personnel and refrain from taking pictures inside temples and monasteries.
- Dress Code: When visiting religious sites, please wear appropriate attire. Men should wear long pants, while women should opt for long skirts or dresses that cover their shoulders.
- Waste Disposal: Please do not litter. The Bhutanese view their natural environment as a sacred gift, so it's important to respect it.
- · Wildlife Guidlines: Don't disturb or feed wild animals.
- Zebra Crossings: Use zebra crossings when crossing roads; failure to do so may result in fines, Use pedestrian walkways when walking.

Don'ts:

- Respect cultural: Avoid touching or pointing feet at religious objects.
- Don't Smoke in Public: Smoking in the public areas is strictly prohibited and liable to be fined. Spitting on the wall and other places is discourage.
- Don't Disturb Wildlife: Keep a safe distance and avoid loud noises or sudden movements around animals.
- No Drones: Visitors can't fly drones. Approval only for government use.
- Avoid politically sensitive issues: It is wise to bear this in mind when conversing with local people. Avoid politically sensitive issues.
- Bargaining: Shops typically have fixed prices for all items, and bargaining is not common.

Dos:

- Take Care of the Environment: Do not litter anywhere. Pack any trash in a small plastic bag and dispose of it at your hotel. The Bhutanese treat their natural environment as a divine gift.

- Stay Hydrated: Drink plenty of water to avoid altitude sickness.
- **Enjoy Local Cuisine:** Try Bhutanese dishes but let the cook know your spice tolerance.
- Always Use Zebra Crossings: Use zebra crossings when crossing roads; failure to do so may result in fines, Use pedestrian walkways when walking.

Don'ts:

- Don't Disrespect Religious Symbols: Avoid touching or pointing feet at religious objects and Royal family photos.
- **Don't Smoke in Public:** Smoking in the public areas is strictly prohibited and liable to be fined, so please refrain from smoking in public areas. Spitting on the wall and other places is discourage.
- Don't Disturb Wildlife: Keep a safe distance and avoid loud noises or sudden movements around animals.
- No Drones: Visitors can't fly drones. Approval only for government use.
- Avoid politically sensitive issues: It is wise to bear this in mind when conversing with local people. Avoid politically sensitive issues.
